## **CARIBBEAN HISTORY**

You are invited to join this new and exciting ten-week course which will run at **Park Campus**, Boughton Green Road, Northampton on **Thursday evenings from 6.00-8.00 pm**, starting on **28 April 2011**.

The first session introduces the geographical, ethnic and political make-up of the islands, as well as pre-colonial settlement.

**Topics covered during the course include:**

- European Settlement and the establishment of the Slave Society
- The Slave Trade
- The Post Emancipation Caribbean
- Growth of Caribbean Identity and Nationalism
- Caribbean in the era of the Two World Wars
- The Move to Independence
- Race and Immigration

No prior qualifications are necessary and people of all ages are welcome. You can obtain 10 Higher Education credits if you complete one piece of written coursework. There is also a University certificate for those choosing the attendance-only route through the course.

The subsidised **course fee of £60** entitles you to use a wide range of University facilities.
